REMINDERS

Plant within the perimeter of your plot

Please do not plant outside the perimeter of your plot and keep the pathways around your garden clear of debris.

Do not put rocks on the grass

Rocks and trash can damage the lawn mower and may harm the driver. If you want to remove rocks from your plot, please take them away with you or stack them in a corner within the confines of your garden.

Only drive on the road

If you drive to the garden, please keep your car on the road marked on the map and at a safe distance from the plots. Driving between plots has caused several incidents including broken water pipes. There is parking for multiple cars available near the tool shed.

Keep our garden beautiful!

Let's work together to make our garden look beautiful for our neighbours and ourselves! Do your best to keep your plot tidy and weedfree, avoid using orange snow fencing, and don't forget to take your trash and compost home regularly.
